Singular and Plural Possessive Nouns

A possessive noun is a noun that shows who or what owns or has something. Add an apostrophe (') + s to a singular noun to make it possessive.

My dentist's office is in my uncle's town.

Add an apostrophe to the end of most plural nouns to make them possessive. Add an apostrophe + s to form the plural of possessive nouns that don't end in -s.

The children's mother visited three teachers' rooms.
