THE HISTORY OF TIME CAPSULES

Going Back in Time!

The first time capsules were not put together to inform future generations about what life was like. Instead, societies thousands of years ago left behind remnants of their civilization in the form of pyramids, tombs, shrines and in some cases buried villages.

One such village was Pompeii, Italy. It is one of the most famous examples of an accidental time capsule. It was buried by poisonous ash from a volcanic eruption in 79 A.D. Archaeologists did not discover Pompeii until 1,500 years later. The volcanic ash from Mt. Vesuvius preserved almost everything in the city, from animals and people to scraps of food.

Since the 1500's, the popularity of stashing away items for future generations to discover has become more and more popular. Secret treasures have been found in walls, basements, and foundations of buildings. Monuments bear plaques that tell a secret is buried beneath.

The Crypt of Civilization is located at Oglethorpe University in Atlanta, Georgia. This crypt, which is the size of an Olympic swimming pool, is filled with all kinds of things. You would find soup bowls, film reels from the 1940's, telephones and record players. The steel door was sealed shut and will not open until 8113! Think of the changes in technology we have had in the past 70 years, let alone, 7000 years!


The people of Colorado Springs, Colorado did not have to wait so long to open their time capsule. The Colorado Springs Century Chest was shut in 1901 and opened 100 years later. The people of Colorado Springs filled the chest with photographs, memorabilia, and letters to the Colorado Springs residents of 2001. All of the treasures have been carefully scanned so you can view them online!

Time capsules are even carrying messages to outer space. A golden record with messages in 55 different languages was launched into space in 1977 on the Voyager Spacecraft to (possibly) send an intergalactic message to extraterrestrial life in the Solar System. It included photos of daily life on Earth. Houses, humans and animals could all be viewed through this record.


